

The Chapelle Expiatoire, built under the Restoration, is a place of remembrance dedicated to Louis XVI and Marie-Antoinette.

It stands on the site of the former Madeleine parish cemetery, where the King and Queen were buried during the Revolution along with the bodies of 500 individuals who were guillotined, including Charlotte Corday, Olympe de Gouges and Madame du Barry. Built at the request of Louis XVIII between 1816 and 1826, the Chapelle Expiatoire is a jewel of neo-classical architecture and early 19th-century Romantic art.

DID YOU KNOW...?

The bones from the former Madeleine cemetery still lie behind the walls of the lower chapel, making the monument a necropolis of the Revolution.
